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## **GENERAL GUIDELINES**

### **2020 OCEANA COUNTY VIRTUAL FAIR**

There will be no live exhibits on display at the Oceana County Fair in 2020. Due to the COVID19 Pandemic, all in-person showing and auction events have been moved to a virtual platform. Other events such as harness racing, horse and tractor pull and demolition derby will be offered on an exhibitor only participation and video live streamed off the Oceana County Fair website – [www.oceanafair.com](http://www.oceanafair.com)

### **FAIR RESIDENCY POLICY**

Due to the unprecedented events in the world today, and the inability to hold an in-person traditional fair, the Oceana County Agricultural Society (Fair Board) wants to make sure that Oceana County youth residents experience as much of a fair as possible in a virtual format. With this in mind, *the Oceana County Agricultural Society reserves the right to limit participation in the Oceana County Fair to youth who are in an Oceana County school district or who are enrolled in a school district that encompasses Oceana County lands. Home-schooled youth must reside in an Oceana County school district or district encompassing Oceana County lands. Open youth class exhibitors shall be limited to Oceana County Residents.*

### **APPEALS AND COMPLAINT POLICY**

An exhibitor compelled to bring a complaint regarding conflict of interest of any judge, disqualification of an exhibit, exhibitor, group leader or superintendent's behavior or the eligibility of an exhibit shall make a formal protest in writing to the Fair Board no later than 10 days following the end of the fair.

All protests shall be referred to the Executive Board, which shall review the protest with interested parties and give parties an opportunity to submit evidence. The party against whom the protest was filed shall have the right to read the statement of protest.

A report of findings shall be made to the Fair Board for final decision on the protest within 10 days of the original complaint. The Fair Board shall issue an opinion within two (2) weeks of receiving the recommendations from the Executive Board.

The Exhibitor may file an appeal to the Department of Agriculture within 45 days of filing the initial complaint if the exhibitor is not satisfied with the Fair Board's action. The Department of Agriculture shall have 60 days after receipt of any appropriately filed appeal to investigate the complaint and shall issue a finding of fact and notice of department action and any recommended actions for the Fair Board.

### **ENTRY INFORMATION**

The 2020 Oceana County Fair will be held virtual through the FairEntry online fair program. See the accompanying instructions on how to enter exhibits online for judging and awarding. There will be no adult classes offered this year and special requirements will apply to many classes for judging purposes. You are encouraged to read the instructions thoroughly. You may contact the MSU Extension Office at 231-873-2129 for registration questions.

**REGISTRATION OPENS SATURDAY, AUGUST 1, 2020 AND CLOSSES FRIDAY, AUGUST 14, 2020.**

### **4-H LIVESTOCK AUCTION ANIMAL POOLING**

All animals participating in the virtual 4-H Market Livestock Auction, 4-H Small Market Auction and Junior Market Auction will be brought to the Oceana County Fairgrounds on Sunday, August 30, 2020 for loading onto hauling trucks for slaughter and processing. Following each of the auctions, MSU Extension will be in contact with the participant to provide a time that they are to have their animals at the Fairgrounds on Sunday. During this loading event, social distancing will be adhered to and participants will be expected to not remove their animal from trailers until their designated time or as directed by the animal species superintendent. Once their animal has been loaded on a hauling truck, participants will be expected to leave the Fairgrounds. There is to be no socializing after the transferring of the animals.

### **4-H CLASSES & YOUTH CLASSES**

Any youth (age 5 to 21 as of January 1 of the current fair year) may exhibit in any of the departments listed and participate in the premiums listed. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure they meet any age requirements and/or other requirements for any chosen department. The Fair Board encourages interested exhibitors to participate in any and all animal, or still exhibit of interest.

Registered 4-H participants may register their exhibits using their 4-H Online login and password on the FairEntry website. Youth age 5 by January 1 of current fair year up to age 19 shall be entitled to exhibit any articles to compete for premiums.

No exhibitor may enter the same class twice, even if the item to be displayed is slightly different. Those entering a class twice will have one of the entries disqualified.

### **JUDGES and PREMIUM AWARDS**

All judging will be conducted virtually. The Danish system of judging will be used and no best of show, grand or reserve champions will be awarded. Specific requirements will apply for exhibit registrations, please take time to read the registration requirements. Results of judging will be posted online at the close of the judging process.

No person shall act as judge for awarding a premium for which he is in anyway a competitor. A violation of this rule will result in forfeiture of any premium awarded to him/her.

Judges shall not have a management or supervisory role at the fair. There shall not be an ongoing and direct relationship between the judge or exhibitor within the class(es) being judged.

**Premium Awards:** Youth Open Class exhibitors meeting the age requirements of 5-19 will be entitled to exhibit any articles to *compete* for premiums. 4-H Youth (using their 4-H number) between the ages of 5-7 years old will only receive a participation ribbon for any classes they have entered. 4-H youth age 8 by January 1 of current fair year up to age 19 shall be entitled to exhibit any articles to compete for premiums.

Ribbons will be awarded for all places as listed for each class, unless otherwise specified.

The Society reserves the right to withhold the premium in every case in which it shall appear to the Executive Committee that the regulations have not been complied with or that fraud or deception has been practiced or attempted.

Premiums shall be paid pro-rata at any time after the first meeting of the Board of Directors after the Fair and before the annual meeting in November.

### **EXHIBIT CLASSES**

**THERE WILL BE NO ADDITIONAL CLASSES ADDED TO THIS ABBREVIATED FAIRBOOK PRIOR TO THE FAIR. ONLY THOSE CLASSES PRINTED WITHIN THIS BOOK WILL BE THE CLASSES AVAILABLE ONLINE THAT AN EXHIBITOR MAY ENTER. ANY CLASS FOUND TO BE ADDED AFTER THIS BOOK HAS BEEN PUBLISHED WILL BE DISQUALIFIED AND NO PREMIUMS WILL BE AWARDED.**

### **SUPERINTENDENT RESPONSIBILITIES**

Animal superintendents in the Beef, Swine, Lamb, Goat, Poultry and Rabbit Departments will be called upon to assist on Sunday, August 30<sup>th</sup> with the loading of animals to slaughter/processing destinations. MSU Extension will coordinate the time frame with each superintendent once the hauling paperwork is complete.

### **DRUG TESTING POLICY**

The Oceana County Agricultural Society reserves the right to administer spot tests on any or all livestock entered in the Oceana county Fair if deemed necessary by the Fair management or a written complaint.

#### **PROCEDURE TO REQUEST A DRUG TEST ON AN ANIMAL**

1. Party requesting the test must turn in a written and signed request for testing to either the building superintendent of that species, an MSU Extension staff person or the Fair Board.
2. Written signed complaint must include name of the animal(s) owner, description of animal(s) and where the animal(s) is stalled and reason for asking that the test be administered.
3. The Fair Veterinarian will be contacted to take the sample in accordance with the MDARD (Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development) procedures.
4. Request must be accompanied by a check in the amount of \$75.00 made payable to the Oceana County Agricultural Society. In addition, the person(s) being accused will provide a \$50.00 bond, also payable to the Oceana County Agricultural Society. If the test sample proves to be negative the \$75.00 will be bond will be returned. If the test proves positive for drugs, the owner of the animal(s) will be charged an additional fee of \$100.00 for the verification of the test plus the \$50.00 bond money the owner paid will be forfeited.
5. Any monies due the exhibitor from premiums will be held until the test results are complete. If it is deemed that the animal(s) were drugged, all monies will be forfeited and if it is a 4-H project involved, the Oceana County MSU Extension Office and the 4-H program reserves the right to take further action against the exhibitor.

## **PAYMENT OF PREMIUM AWARDS**

If these dates should need to be changed due to world events etc., all exhibitors will receive email notification of new dates and locations. Anyone unable to pick-up their premium awards on these dates, must contact Doug Fris, Treasurer to make other arrangements. All premium awards not claimed by November 1<sup>st</sup> will be forfeited and returned to the Oceana County Agricultural Society.

### **DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH**

4-H Youth Building Superintendents: Cathy & Grace Alvesteffer

#### **BASIC ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR YOUTH**

1. Boys and girls, ages 5 through 19, are eligible to exhibit in youth classes provided youth are 19 years of age and under as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year and have obtained the age of 5 prior to January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current fair year.
2. Exhibitors may enter only one exhibit in each class.
3. All exhibits must be made, grown or raised by the exhibiting youth this past year. A project is an activity resulting in the creation of an item to be displayed that has taken several steps (hours, days, weeks or months) to complete. This will be the original work of the exhibitor and of the highest quality.
4. Entry registration opens Saturday, August 1, 2020. All entries must be entered by Friday, August 14, 2020 to be eligible for judging through the FairEntry website.
5. Exhibits will be disqualified if specific guidelines are not met or if not entered in proper class.
6. All exhibitors will be required to complete four questions for each exhibit that include age, years in project, information about the project/entry and information about the exhibitor. Pictures and videos will be required as part of the entry system for judging. Please read department rules pertaining to entries.
6. All non-animal exhibits will be judged according to the Danish System. In the Danish System exhibitors are measured against standards, not ranked against other exhibitors (all youth will receive an A, B or C ribbon).
7. Ownership or owner's permission is required for an exhibitor to show any animal.

8. The Junior Small Market Animal program is not a 4-H project. It is for youth 5-7 years of age by January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current fair year. But in order to assure buyers of a quality product all the rules and regulations that apply to the 4-H Small Market Animals also apply to Junior Small Market Animals. (See 4-H Specific #4 below)
9. Any exhibitor may file a complaint for any of the following reasons:
  - a. Conflict of interest in judging
  - b. Disqualification of an exhibit or exhibitor
  - c. Exhibitor, group leader or superintendent's behavior
  - d. Eligibility of exhibitor

**4-H Specific Rules:**

1. Rules governing 4-H animal projects and vegetable project displays are available from the Oceana County MSU Extension Service office.
2. All 4-H animals must be under the 4-Her's care.
3. Ownership is required for an exhibitor for many market animals, with the exception of those exhibitors registered in the 4-H Little Buddy Program. Those classes pertaining to the Market Livestock Program are under the direct supervision of the Oceana 4-H Market Livestock Committee, which is the sole authority on all matters pertaining to those classes. Those classes pertaining to the Small Market Program are under the direct supervision of the 4-H Small Market Animal Association, which is the sole authority on all matters pertaining to those classes.
4. Small Market Animal program rules and regulations that apply, include all the deadlines, number of educational meetings that have to be attended, the proper medications and medication withdrawals, weights, owning the animal and anything else that may apply.

**NOTICE:  
5-7-YEAR-OLD RULES**

**5-7 Open Class Participants:** It is the Oceana County Ag Society's requirement that youth between the ages of 5-7 exhibiting animals requiring a halter or lead must have a parent, adult volunteer or older youth volunteer holding the lead or halter of the animal during the showing. Youth registered as an Open Class participant between the ages of 5-7 years exhibiting non-haltered animals such as swine, rabbits or poultry must be directly assisted one-on-one by a parent, adult volunteer or older youth while the child is in contact with animal. If you are showing Open as a Junior Market project, you must sign an agreement to follow the 4-H Cloverbud rules when registering your project.

**5-7 4-H Cloverbud Participants** (using their 4-H number): For youth exhibitors between the ages of 5-7 exhibiting animals requiring a halter or lead must have a parent, adult volunteer or older youth volunteer holding the lead or halter of the animal during the showing. Youth registered as a 4-H Cloverbud participant between the ages of 5-7 years exhibiting non-haltered animals such as swine, rabbits or poultry must be directly assisted one-on-one by a parent, adult volunteer or older youth while the child is in contact with animal.
